Did you know?

First exploration of the Cohuna district was made by Major Mitchell in 1836.

One tree marked on the expedition is still in existence on the Barr Creek at Koroop, and his camping place at Wee Wee Rup is now a picnic area, accessible from the Murray Valley Highway.

The name 'Cohuna' is an aboriginal word meaning "Native Companion (Brolga)". It has a population of 2,200 people (4,319 in the whole shire) and is 270 Kilometres from Melbourne and 80.5 metres above sea level.

Friendly reminders

We wish for everyone's stay here with us to be a memorable one so if we could all be considerate of others and be mindful of our park rules it would be much appreciated by all.

Vehicles – The safety of everyone is of prime importance, you can assist our cause by limiting the speed of your vehicle to five kilometres (walking pace) within the park.

Pets – Your pets are very welcome, however can you please ensure they are well behaved, always kept on a leash and you are responsible for cleaning up after them at all times. No pets allowed in onsite accommodation, laundries or amenities at any time for any reason.

Children – The park and its facilities are provided for the enjoyment of you and your children. The supervision of your children is important for their safety and to ensure they do not disturb other people in the park. We would ask for all children to be back at their sites by 10 pm. Children must be accompanied by an adult when visiting the amenities.

Pool - Please ensure that children are supervised by an adult at all times and observe our pool rules for everyone's safety and enjoyment.

Jumping pillow – Please be mindful of all others while on the pillow so everyone can enjoy.

Bikes – For the safety of yourself and your children please ensure helmets are worn at all times, no riding around amenities or BBQs and no riding once the street lights are on. Please remember we have shared roadways.

Noise – The peaceful enjoyment of our park and its facilities by all visitors is important to us. Please assist by being considerate to your neighbours and restrict noise from radios, televisions and social gatherings after 10 pm at night and before 7 am.

Securing your site – While park management do their best to ensure a safe and secure environment, it is recommended that visitors to CWHP take the precaution of securing all items left outside their tent, van or cabin during the day and overnight.

Annual site reminders

Annual site holders please ensure your site fees and electricity accounts are paid in accordance with your site agreements. Site fees are due on the first day of the quarter and electricity accounts are due 14 days from receipt of your account each quarter. Any annual site holder who currently has outstanding fees/electricity please contact the office ASAP to attend to these or discuss same. Thank you.

Annuals site numbering: there are still some annual sites which are yet to display their site number. Please attend to this ASAP as it is a safety requirement for emergency services, it would be much appreciated.

On your next visit, annuals may bring their old light globes from their vans into the office and change them over to energy savings globes free of charge.

Annuals when cleaning up your vans/sites please do not leave your hard rubbish eg old furnishings/white goods etc for us to remove, it is your responsibility to remove your own hard rubbish. The transfer station is open Tuesdays and Fridays 10 am to 2 pm and Sundays 1 pm 5 pm, their contact number is: 54562613.
